The Composting Circle - Community Supported Composting

You could think of this as Community Supported Composting, along the lines of Community Supported Agriculture, where you purchase a share of a farm's output at the beginning of the year. Except in this case, there is also a service aspect to it: instead of having to maintain your own composting setup, you bring your compostables to me, and I take care of composting them properly*.

The idea for this was born when a couple friends asked me to consult with them on setting up a home composting setup. Because they are extremely busy, and travel a lot, we could not come up with a system they could maintain well. In a follow-up conversation, I suggested that I compost for them, and return finished compost - for a fee, of course.

Here's how the Composting Circle works:

I provide three- or five-gallon plastic buckets with tight-fitting lids, and containers of sawdust. It is best if these are kept in a garage or shed, but a couple households are keeping them outside, and we have not had animal break-ins yet.

You accumulate your kitchen waste, perhaps in a ceramic or stainless container on your countertop or under the sink.

Empty that container as needed into the larger bucket and add a scoop of sawdust. This helps keep the odors down, and makes a better compost mix.

When a bucket is full, you drop it off one of our dropoff points. (Pickup service is available.) You may also drop off bags of yard waste and leaves.

You take home compost. There are several ways this can work – contact me, and I will outline your options.

* MAYTime Composting is permitted through NC DENR to do commercial composting of yard waste, manures, agricultural waste, pre- and post-consumer food waste. Among other things, this means that we must meet EPA standards for pathogen reduction, and that we must document this.
